Laborers Joint Grievance Committee

The Laborers Joint Grievance Committee did not meet in March. The next meeting is currently set for April 28, 2020, at the Laborers Burr Ridge office beginning at 9:00 a.m. Due to Governor Pritzker's Shelter in Place Order recently being extended through April 30, 2020, it is unclear if this meeting will proceed as planned.

Operating Engineers Joint Grievance Committee

The March 18, 2020 meeting of the Operating Engineers Joint Grievance Committee was postponed. The next meeting is scheduled for May 13, 2020, at the office of Local 150 in Countryside, IL beginning at 8:30 a.m. There are currently six (6) grievances on the docket.

Teamsters Joint Grievance Committee

The Teamsters Joint Grievance Committee did not meet in March. The next regularly scheduled grievance committee hearing is scheduled for April 30, at a location to be determined. would be centered around a \$760 billion infrastructure program. Uncertainty surrounds the funding source of the plan and whether Republican leadership will be willing to join in on the effort.
